
NEW PUPPY CHECKLIST

Whether you're a first-time adopter or an experienced pet parent, this vet-approved checklist will help turn your house into a home for your new puppy.





Essential Items

- A cozy crate that helps them feel safe
- Poop bags
- A comfortable bed
- · Chew toys and treats
- Stainless steel or porcelain
- food and water bowls
- Leash, harness, and collar with I.D.
- Gentle puppy shampoo, hair brush, toothbrush

The First Week

- Get insurance for the first year at least (costs add up!)
- Visit the vet for a first checkup
- Have them microchipped
- Make sure your home is puppy proof
- Keep feeding them the same food they've been eating



Puppy Proof

- Cover electrical outlets Cover trash cans Remove toxic plants Put away medicine and cleaning products
- Make sure they have easy access to their food, water, crate, and bed
- Keep doors closed or use gates to block off certain areas

Routine

- Brush their teeth daily or at a minimum of once a week
- Get them used to bathing and ear
- cleaning every 1-2 months
- Schedule their first professional grooming appointment
- Feed them 3 times a day once
- they're older than 6 weeks
- Brush their hair once a day
- Get them used to their paws
- being handled and nail trims
- Create a schedule that includes
- playtime and potty breaks
- Start them on monthly flea, tick,
- heartworm, and intestinal parasites
- preventative

As your puppy grows throughout their first year, these are some of the moments that you'll experience together. Their puppy phase lasts 9-15 months, depending on their breed size.


